Norway Spruce	60	30	M-R	P-F	A large, pyramidal tree with long, cylindrical cones that hang on the dark green weeping branches. Adaptable and good for windbreaks.	
Colorado Blue Spruce	60	20	S	P-F	A conical-shaped evergreen tree with short stiff needles. Often used in residential landscapes. Needles are often blue green in color.	
Douglas Fir	60	16	S-M	P-F	A large, pyramidal evergreen with silvery gray-green, shiny needles. Needles smell of camphor when crushed. found in Residential areas and Parks. Attract Birds and Mammals.	
White Pine	65	30	M-R	P-F	Has feathery needles, open canopy, and straight trunk. Attracts game birds, songbirds and small mammals. These trees are great for landscapes with ample space.	
White Cedar	50	15	M	F	A large, narrow evergreen with pointy, blue-green needles. Adaptable to wet, well-drained soils.	
Red Oak	75	75	M	P-F	Is a fast-growing oak for the home landscape. Leaves emerge a pinkish red, green in the summer and turning to a russet red in the fall. High tolerance of salt and air pollution.	
Black Walnut	75	50	M	F	Has a fruit that is rounded with yellow-green husk containing a nut that is a food source for squirrels. Prefers alkaline, moist and well drained soils.	
Northern Pecan	85	65	R	F	Large and round, with dark green leaves in the summer that turn yellow in the fall. Fruit occurs in clusters and mature in fall.	
Sugar Maple	75	50	M	P-F	In the fall it Shows a range of colors from yellow to burnt orange. Develops into an excellent shade tree making it great for parks or home landscapes.	
Black Cherry	55	25	R	P-F	Has white flower clusters in the spring and dark, pea-sized fruits in the late summer. Performs well in alkaline soils and is tolerant to road salt.	
Overcup Oak	50	50	S	F	A great tree for wetlands and clay type soils. Dark green and shiny leaves that turn red, yellow, or brown in the fall. Produces acorns that are fully covered by their cup.	
Sweet Bay Magnolia	15	15	M	P-F	A small tree, great for residential areas and parks. Fragrant, creamy-white flowers and dark green leaves with silvery undersides. Attracts small mammals.	
Late Lilac	8	6	S-M	F	These shrubs grow rosy-lilac flowers that bloom two weeks after the common lilac. Native to China. Attract bees and butterflies.	
Beach Plum	5	5	M	F	These shrubs produce small sweet to tart fruits in the late summer. They thrive in sandy soil and are salt tolerant.	
Black Elderberry	8	5	R	P-F	Does very well in naturally wet landscapes. Has a white fragrant flower that blooms in the early summer and followed by purple fruit in the late summer.	
American Hazelnut	8	5	M-R	P-F	P-F Shrubs have ovate or heart-shaped leaves, green in summer, yellow in fall. attract seed eaters (blue jays/woodpeckers).	
American Chestnut	70	65	M-R	P-F	-F Large and round, with dark green leaves in summer and yellow in the fall. Tolerant of clay soil and dry sites.	
Domestic Apple	30	20	M	P-F	Leaves grow 2-4 inches, with a oval shape, and bare a small apple. Can be planted in wet areas and will attract wildlife.	
Fall Yellow Raspberry	4	3	M	The same, delicious taste of red varieties, with the ability to produce two crops a season. White flowers with green foliage. Well-drained soil.
